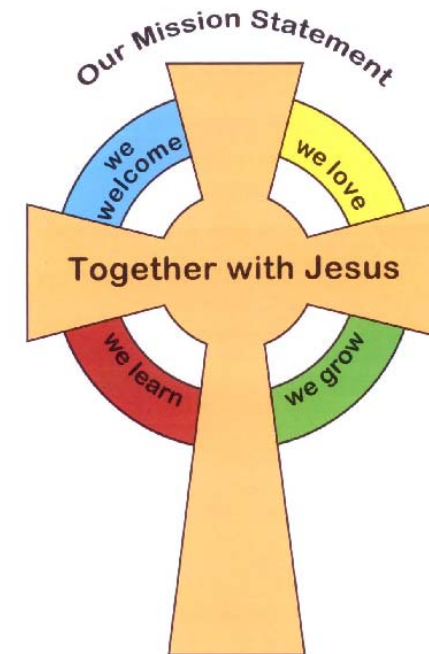

## Admissions for September 2019

- If your child was born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2015 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2016 they may start Nursery in September 2019.
- St Vincent's Nursery has places for 26 children.

## Admission criteria

1. Children from Catholic families who are in the care of a local authority - 'looked-after' children and children who were looked after but left local authority care because they were adopted (or became the subject of a residence order or special guardianship order) and are baptised Catholics.
2. Catholic children of practising Catholic families who live in the parish of St Vincent, Waldegrave Road, Dagenham RM8 2QB.
3. Catholic children of practising Catholic families living outside the parish of St Vincent, Waldegrave Road, Dagenham RM8 2QB.
4. Catholic children living in the parish of St Vincent, Waldegrave Road, Dagenham RM8 2QB.
5. Catholic children who do not live in the parish of St Vincent, Waldegrave Road, Dagenham RM8 2QB.

# How to apply

- **Nursery admissions application form**
- **Certificate of Catholic Practice (from Parish Priest)**
- **Child's baptism certificate**
- **Child's birth certificate**
- **Proof of child's address (child benefit entitlement letter or child's medical card)**
- **Proof of the parent/carer's address (your current Council Tax bill, Council Tax benefit letter)**
- **A utility bill (gas, electric or water) or a bank statement from the last 3 months**

All documents must be submitted to the school office by 3.30pm on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2019.

**St. Vincent's School Office** is open to receive forms

Monday to Thursday 8.30am – 12.30pm and 1.30pm – 4.30pm

Friday 8.30am – 12.30pm and 1.30pm – 3.30pm

You need to bring in the original documents and photocopies for our files.

## **Certificate of Catholic Practice**

If you are applying to more than one of the borough's Catholic Schools and wish to be considered as a practising Catholic, you meet with your Parish Priest and complete the Certificate of Catholic Practice which can only be obtained from the Parish Priest.

Each Catholic school you apply for will need a copy of this form, but may request to see the original which will have the Parish seal.

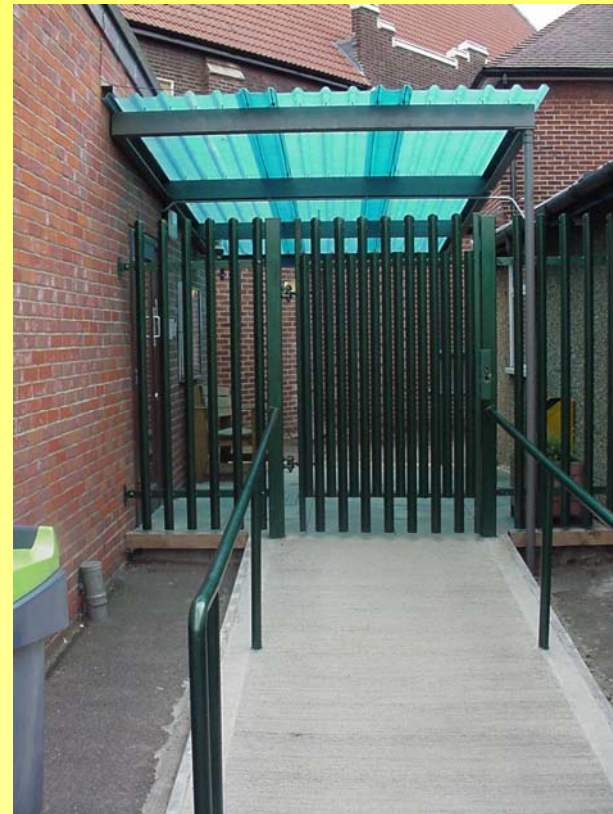
Fr. Joseph is currently on leave. When he returns, we will publish the dates in the Parish newsletter to inform you when he is available to sign forms.



- Closing date for applications – Friday 15th March 2019.  
Any forms received after this date will be a late application.
- Letters offering place or waiting list will be posted on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2019.
- Offer of place/waiting list to accepted by parent/carer by Friday 17th May 2019.
- A place in St. Vincent's Nursery does **NOT** guarantee a place in the school the following year. This is a separate admissions process.

# Nursery Times and Procedures

- 9.00a.m. – 12 p.m.(Term time only)
- At 8.50am the bell rings and a member of staff will let the children enter the building. Nursery children enter via the ramp.
- Children should be brought to Nursery and collected by an adult (18+).

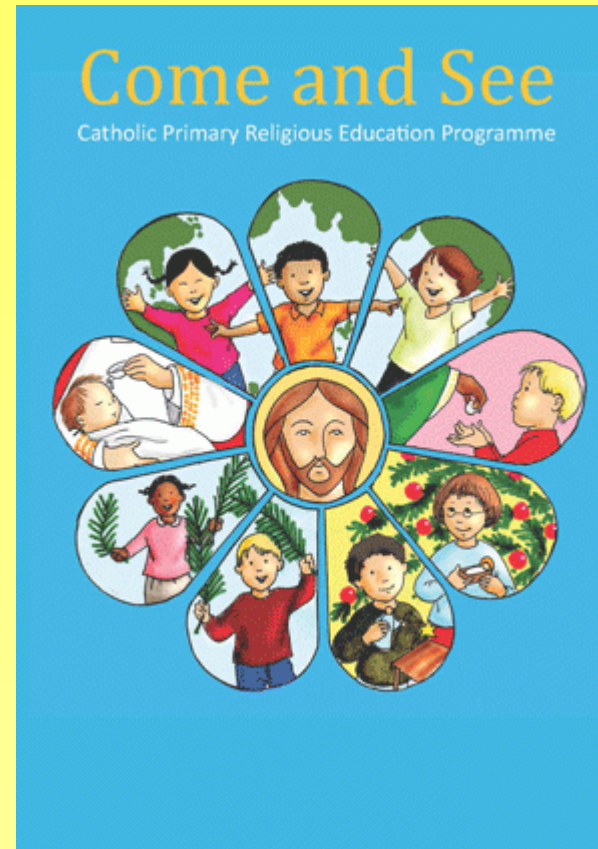

# Starting Nursery tips

It would be helpful if your child could do the following:



- Use the toilet and flush it
- Push up jumper sleeves
- Wash and dry their hands
- Use tissues or handkerchiefs
- Put on, take off and hang up coat
- Fasten own shoes (Velcro)
- Tidy and pack away toys
