Our pains and difficulties are small compared with other people's.

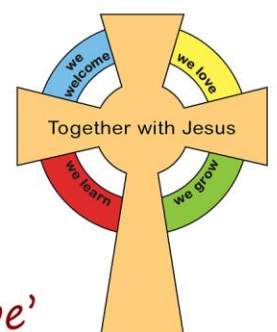
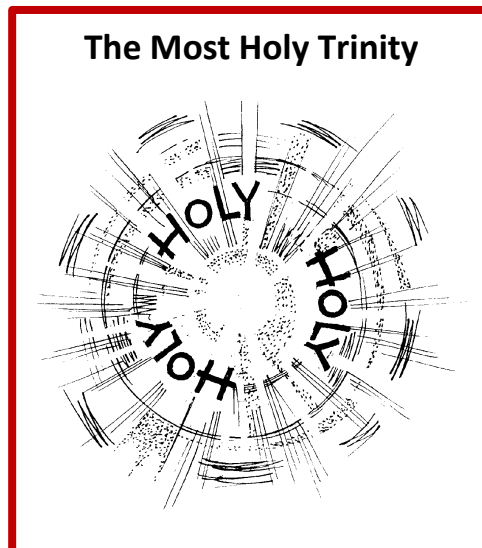


As we think of the present tragedy, we place our hope in God, who eventually will make things right in his Kingdom.
